

Tools/Supplies Needed to Start Auto Collision Repair Technology

1. **Work Shoes or Boots:** with hard soles (steel toes are not required)
2. **Work Uniforms:** Students must acquire suitable work clothing, such as uniform type pants and shirt or coveralls. Cleanliness is the responsibility of the student and is also part of their daily grade. Uniforms **must** be kept clean, so we recommend that several sets of uniforms be purchased. **NOTE:** Jeans, T-shirts, sweatshirts and other non-uniform related clothing will not be permitted.
3. **Large 3-Ring Binder**
4. **Safety Glasses:** The school will provide one pair of non-prescription glasses to first year students. If you wear prescription glasses, they **MUST** be industrial approved safety lenses. If it is necessary for you to purchase industrial safety prescription glasses, you may do so through your eye care physician.
5. **Blowgun:** OSHA approved blowgun (to remove dust). May be purchased from and Auto Parts store. Approximate price is \$15.00.
6. **First Year Student Tools:** The Auto Collision Program will be requiring first year students to begin purchasing hand tools that will be needed on the job. Below is a list of entry-level hand tools that employers would expect you to bring to work. I would suggest that you purchase high quality lifetime guaranteed tools such as Snap-On, S & K, Mac or Craftsman, etc.
 - Combination Pliers
 - Needle Nose Pliers
 - Locking Pliers (Vise Grips)
 - Screwdriver Set (6 piece) Straight Blade and Phillips
 - Wrench Sets
 - Combination Fractional 6 Point
 - Combination Metric 6 Point
 - Adjustable Wrench - 12" Crescent
 - Socket Wrench Sets
 - 3" drive, mm and fractional, deep and shallow 6 pt.
 - 4" drive, mm and fractional, deep and shallow 6 pt.
 - Ball Peen Hammer
 - Rubber Sanding Block
 - Auto Body Pick Hammer
 - Body File
 - Universal Dolly
 - Mechanics Gloves
 - Disposable Camera
 - Tool Box (must be able to be locked)

The School's Weapons Policy does not allow students to transport certain tools to the Crawford County CTC on the school bus. Therefore, Auto Collision students need to make arrangements for the above tools to be dropped off at the Main Office of the CCCTC and delivered to the Assistant Director.
