Crawford County K-12 Career Education Alliance will provide you with opportunities to have career related experiences that help to connect what you learn in the classroom to what you will need to know for the career.

Opportunities Available:

Job Shadowing - you can visit a site anywhere from a 1/2 day to a full day to experience what the day to day duties of a specific career includes or to experience how the site operates as a whole and what careers it has to offer

Summer Internship Program (for students entering 11th and 12th grades only) - this is the next step after a job shadow visit. Internships are as short as 3 weeks or as long as 10 weeks and are usually unpaid positions. Please see your guidance counselor for a listing of the Summer Internship Opportunities.

Career Day - varies by school

Career Camp (for students entering 7th and 8th grades only)

Career Mentor - The K-12 Career Education Alliance office provides career mentors to those students who are seriously pursuing a specific career path. You should contact the K-12 Career Education Alliance office to request a Career Mentor.

What Do I Have To Do?

Job Shadows

- 1.) Your school district Job Shadowing application packet must be completed before a Job Shadowing visit can take place. Packets are available through the guidance office or through K-12 Career Education Alliance.
- 2.) Transportation to the job shadow site is your responsibility. If transportation is an issue, please contact the K-12 Career Education Alliance office for assistance.
- 3.) You will need to dress according to the environment of the site you visit.
- 4.) You will need to ask questions and interact with your shadow partner.
