Lesson: Word Wall Letter Aa  
Date: 7/9/04  
Business/ Agency Visited: Little Champs Child Development Center

Academic Standards Addressed:  
Recognize the letter Aa  
Read words that begin with the letter Aa.

### Objectives:

To recognize words that begin with the letter Aa. To read words in print that begin with the letter Aa. To recognize words that begin with the sound a.

### Introduction/Motivation:

- Before the children arrive put a piece of construction paper on the board with the letters A a at the top.

### Activity/Procedure:

- During circle time ask if anyone knows what letter it is and what sound it makes.
- Introduce the letter and sound. Explain that many words begin with this letter. It is even a word itself. Read "Big A Little a What Begins with A" by Dr. Seuss.
- Ask the children if they know any words that begin with Aa. The children can be encouraged to look around the room for words or objects to help them. (The room is labeled with words.)
- Write the words on paper and cut them out in configuration form. This will help the children read more words in their environment.
- Talk about the words and review the words you have added to the word wall letter Aa block.

**Materials:**

1 piece of colored construction paper with the letter Aa printed at the top

1 piece of white writing paper with lines

marker

scissors

tape

**Assessment:**

Through observation I will be able to assess that the children will be able to read the word "a". The children will be able to tell me what sounds "a" makes and tell me one word that begins with Aa.
